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Assessment of repeated dose toxicity: Chronic exposures have been known to produce pneumoconiosis (chronic inflammatory and fibrotic lung disease).

Information on: dichromium trioxide

Assessment of repeated dose toxicity: Repeated oral uptake of the substance did not cause substance-related effects. Repeated inhalative uptake of the substance did not cause substance-related effects.

Information on: Iron oxide

Assessment of repeated dose toxicity: The substance may cause increase in lung mass and lung tissue changes after repeated inhalation. The product has not been fully tested. The statements have been derived in parts from products of a similar structure or composition.

Chronic exposures have been known to produce pneumoconiosis (chronic inflammatory and fibrotic lung disease).

Genetic toxicity

Information on: dichromium trioxide

Assessment of mutagenicity: The substance was not mutagenic in bacteria. The substance was mutagenic in a mammalian cell culture test system. The substance was genotoxic in mammalian cell culture. The substance was not genotoxic in a test with mammals. The product has not been fully tested. The statements have been derived in parts from products of a similar structure or composition.

Carcinogenicity

Information on: Titanium dioxide

Assessment of carcinogenicity: IARC (International Agency for Research on Cancer) has classified this substance as group 2B (The agent is possibly carcinogenic to humans). In long-term studies in rats in which the substance was given by inhalation, a carcinogenic effect was observed. Tumors were only observed in rats after chronic inhalative exposure to high concentrations which caused sustained lung inflammation. In long-term studies in rats and mice in which the substance was given by feed, a carcinogenic effect was not observed. Dermal exposure is not expected to be carcinogenic.

Teratogenicity

Information on: dichromium trioxide

Assessment of teratogenicity: No indications of a developmental toxic / teratogenic effect were seen in animal studies. The results were determined in a Screening test (OECD 421/422).

Other Information

The product has not been tested. The statements on toxicology have been derived from the properties of the individual components. The product has been assessed on the basis of the components' available data. To some extent data gaps exist for individual components. According to our present knowledge and experience dangers which are not covered by the current labeling are not to be expected.
